### **LEARNING JOURNEY**

ESTIMATED 4 - 6 MONTHS

### 1. Form the framing questions.

Industry Experts and Funders work together to create a framing question used to seek out solutions for each problem area. Support from representatives of beneficiary communities will be provided where appropriate. Industry Experts who work on these questions and who will assist with screening, will be paid \$10,000 for their time.

### 2. Seek proposals and screen.

In response to the framing questions, one-page proposals are received. **GeShiDo** screens them to come up with a list of **approximately 40 Possible Solution Implementors**, who will be asked to submit a full proposal. **Industry Experts** who choose to submit a proposal will no longer be a part of the screening community and their compensation will end.

### 3. Form an Evaluation Cohort.

8 to 10 Solution Implementors per issue area are chosen to attend a two-day retreat with Industry Experts, Funders and GeShiDo to further develop their proposals in context of the other organizations who are now part of this cohort, set the funding evaluation criteria and connect players within the ecosystems that they are operating in.

### 4. Allocate the funds.

**Funders** and **Solution Implementors** separately decide how best to allocate funds. Then, they come together to see where the divergence is, and make final decisions about fund allocation.

Funds are distributed.

### 5. Solutions are deployed.

Throughout the funding period, **Solution Implementors** and **Funders** will connect to learn how things are progressing, gain deeper insights on the issue area, and determine if there is a need to pivot.

### 6. Share what we learned.

While a continuous feedback loop will exist throughout the funding period, final reports will indicate if the approach shifted the balance of power; demonstrated that beg bets vrs. single bets are more effective; and, sufficiently answered the framing question.


